

# WASTE SEGREGATION SYSTEM

## METALS AND PLASTICS

### THROW IN HERE:

**Plastics:** beverage bottles (empty), screw caps, foils, bags, food packaging (e.g. yoghurts), packaging of household chemicals.

**Metals:** steel and aluminum cans.

**Milk and beverage cartons, multi-material packaging.**

### DO NOT THROW IN HERE:

Waste electronic equipment, packages with the contents of the products hazardous, paints, batteries and batteries, diapers

## PAPER

### THROW IN HERE:

**Paper, cardboard:** cardboard, paper, newspapers, magazines, leaflets, catalogues, school papers, office papers

### DO NOT THROW IN HERE:

Greasy, dirty, wet paper, hygienic paper (toilet, wipes, cotton swabs)

## GLASS

### THROW IN HERE:

**White and colored glass:** hollow glass jars, glass bottles, glass packaging after cosmetics

### DO NOT THROW IN HERE:

Porcelain, glasses, glasses, ceramics, mirrors, windows, candles, light bulbs, cups, pots, window glass, spectacle glass

## BIO

### THROW IN HERE:

**Kitchen waste:** peelings, eggshells, food debris, fruits, vegetables.

**Green waste:** grass, small branches, leaves, flowers.

### DO NOT THROW IN HERE:

Bones of animals, ash, other waste

Waste remaining after segregation should be disposed of in MIXED (residual) WASTE

Bulky waste, waste electrical and electronic equipment, light bulbs, batteries, accumulators, paint packaging should be returned to the Selective Collection Point Municipal Waste (PSZOK).

applies to packaging not covered by the deposit system
